2019-20 WCF Scholars Society

The majority of WCF's scholarship recipients attend Bevill State and are members of our **Scholars Society**. They receive full tuition scholarships for up to two years (\$10,500 value) if they maintain a 2.75 GPA and participate in at least one community service activity each semester. They are provided monthly lunch meetings, a sophomore mentor, work skills training sessions, and opportunities to visit four-year colleges.

The scholarships provided to all of these students originate from families who have established endowed scholarship funds and from individuals and businesses who have made contributions for student scholarships. More than half of our scholars are first generation college students. These funds open doors to brighter opportunities for them and change the stories of their futures. 





I am currently working with our team of designers on the Medal of Honor Museum in Chattanooga, opening in 2020. Eventually, I want to open my own design firm here in Jasper. Without the assistance from the Walker College Foundation, I would not have been able to graduate and pursue my dreams."

Justice recently bought a house in Walker County and was married at the end of September.

"The investment the Walker College Foundation made in my life is enabling me to achieve my goals. Hopefully, soon, I'll be able to give back in a big way."
