The legacy of Dr. David J. Rowland


On December 23, 2019, our community lost a great man...Dr. David Jack Rowland. He was 98.

Dr. Rowland was born in Columbus, Ohio on June 17, 1921. He graduated from Lash High School in Zanesville, Ohio in 1938; from Ohio University with a Bachelor's of Science in 1949; the University of Alabama with a Master of Arts in 1951; was awarded an L.L.D from Jacksonville State University and an Litt.D. from Athens State University.

Dr. Rowland was well known for his love of America. He enlisted as a private in the U.S. Army and rose to the rank of Colonel, retiring in 1977. He was Chairman of the Map Department, 3rd Army Intelligence School, and served as a Platoon leader, Company Commander, Detachment Commander, G-2, and Chief of Staff in the Army. During World War II, he was stationed in the American Theater, including pre-flight training at The University of Alabama. It was there he met Mary Ellen Stinson from Birmingham. They married on April 8, 1944 and were married for 63 years until her death in April 2007.

In 1956, Dr. Rowland was named President of Walker College and served in that role until his retirement in 1988. He then served as Chancellor of Walker College from 1988 to 1995 and as Interim President and Vice President of UAB from 1995-1997. Upon his arrival at Walker College, the college had 32 students, four teachers and one building. After 40 years of service, Walker College was an accredited college with over 1,000 students, 14 buildings, and an endowment of over \$5 million. His desire

for our community to have accessible higher education created a legacy that will exist for generations through Bevill State Community College (formerly Walker College) and the Walker College Foundation (WCF), a scholarship foundation created from the Walker College endowment that provides scholarships for students attending Bevill State and other colleges.

Dr. Rowland was an avid community supporter. He served on many boards including the WCF Board of Trustees, the Board of Directors of both the First National (cont. on page 2)

Dr. Rowland was member of the FUMC of Jasper for 63 years. He was a Mason, a member of the Military Officers Association of the U.S., and a member of the American Legion. His civilian awards include the Rotary International

Paul Harris Fellow, the Boy Scouts of America Silver Beaver Award, Alabama Senior Hall of Fame, and Top 50 Over 50 in Alabama. The City of Jasper declared June 30, 2015 as Dr. David Rowland Day. In 2016, the I-22 bridge over Town Creek was proclaimed the Dr. David Jack Rowland Bridge.

After retirement, Dr. Rowland spent his time as an amateur artist, writer, wood carver, and volunteer. He enjoyed tree and horse farming, developing real estate, art shows, long walks, and traveling. He will be missed by all of us.
