Curry High School alumni fund scholarships for seniors

Classes of 1964, 1965, 1966, and 1967 help Curry High School Seniors attend college

Curry High School (CHS) Alumni from the Classes 1964-1967 worked together to raise funds to provide full tuition scholarships to Bevill State for two CHS seniors. The scholarships, named the Sherron Harbison / James Woods / Veterans of Curry High School Classes 1964-67, were established to honor their fallen veterans and the CHS Classes of 1964-67. Victoria Taylor and Madelyn Cagle were the recipients of the scholarships.

Sherron Harbison graduated from CHS in May 1966. He played football and ran track. He was drafted in July 1966. His training was in Fort Benning, GA and then he went to the 1st Calvary Division in Fort Hood, TX. Before going to Vietnam, he married his high school sweetheart. They were married for 320 days before he was killed on May 5, 1968. His widow, Carolyn Rivers Harbison Herr, noted that Sherron

would be very grateful for this honor.

James Woods graduated from CHS in May 1966. He was in FFA and on the annual staff. He was voted Most Considerate in his class. He worked at U.S. Steel until he went to basic training in November 1967. James married Bobbie Faye Guthrie in 1966. They had one child, Tammy Faye Woods, who only survived a few days. He was called to service May 13, 1968 and was killed July 4, 1968. His remains were buried next to his daughter in Bennett Cemetery.

The first scholarship recipient, **Victoria Taylor**, will pursue a degree in **Early Childhood Development** when she begins
Bevill State. As a CHS student, she was a
member of the Anchor Club, Key Club, Beta
Club, FCCLA, FBLA, and was a Chamber of
Commerce of Walker County Junior
Ambassador. She was on the A/B Honor
Roll and Perfect Attendance list.

The second recipient, **Madelyn "Maddi'** Cagle, will pursue a degree in **Nursing** from Bevill State. At CHS, she was part of the BETA Club, National Honor Society, SGA, FCCLA, and SADD. She was on the A/B Honor Roll.

In her thank you note, Maddi wrote, "This scholarship means so much to me. I will work hard to show how much I appreciate this chance. Thank you for making my dreams come true!
